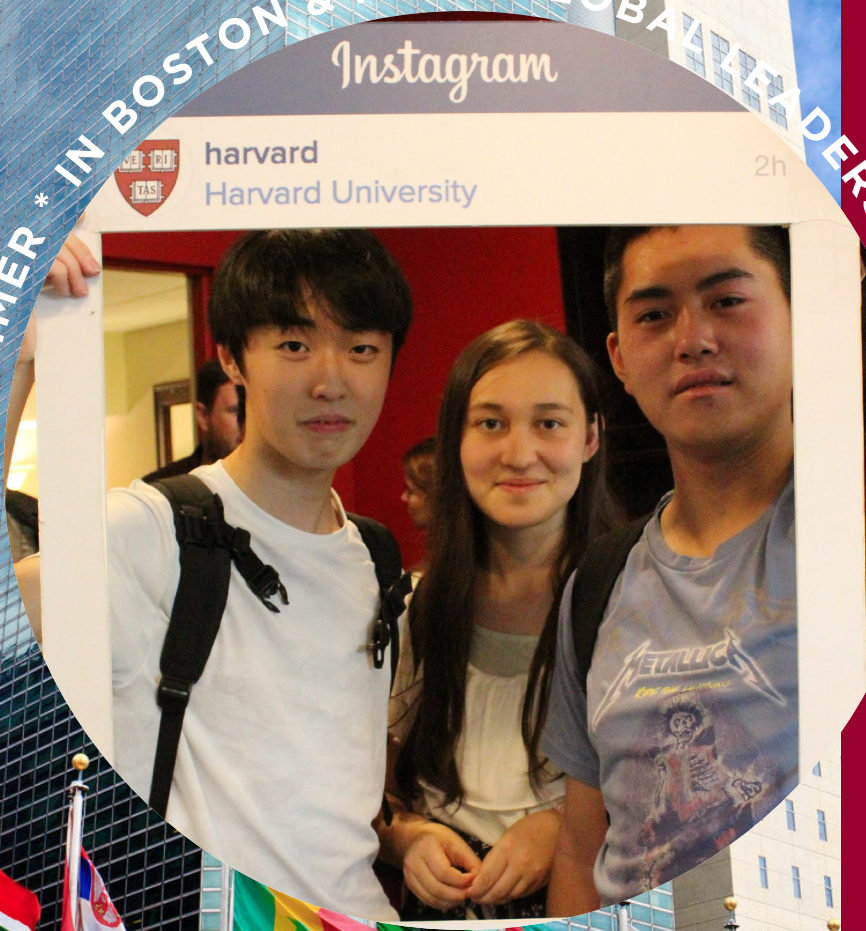

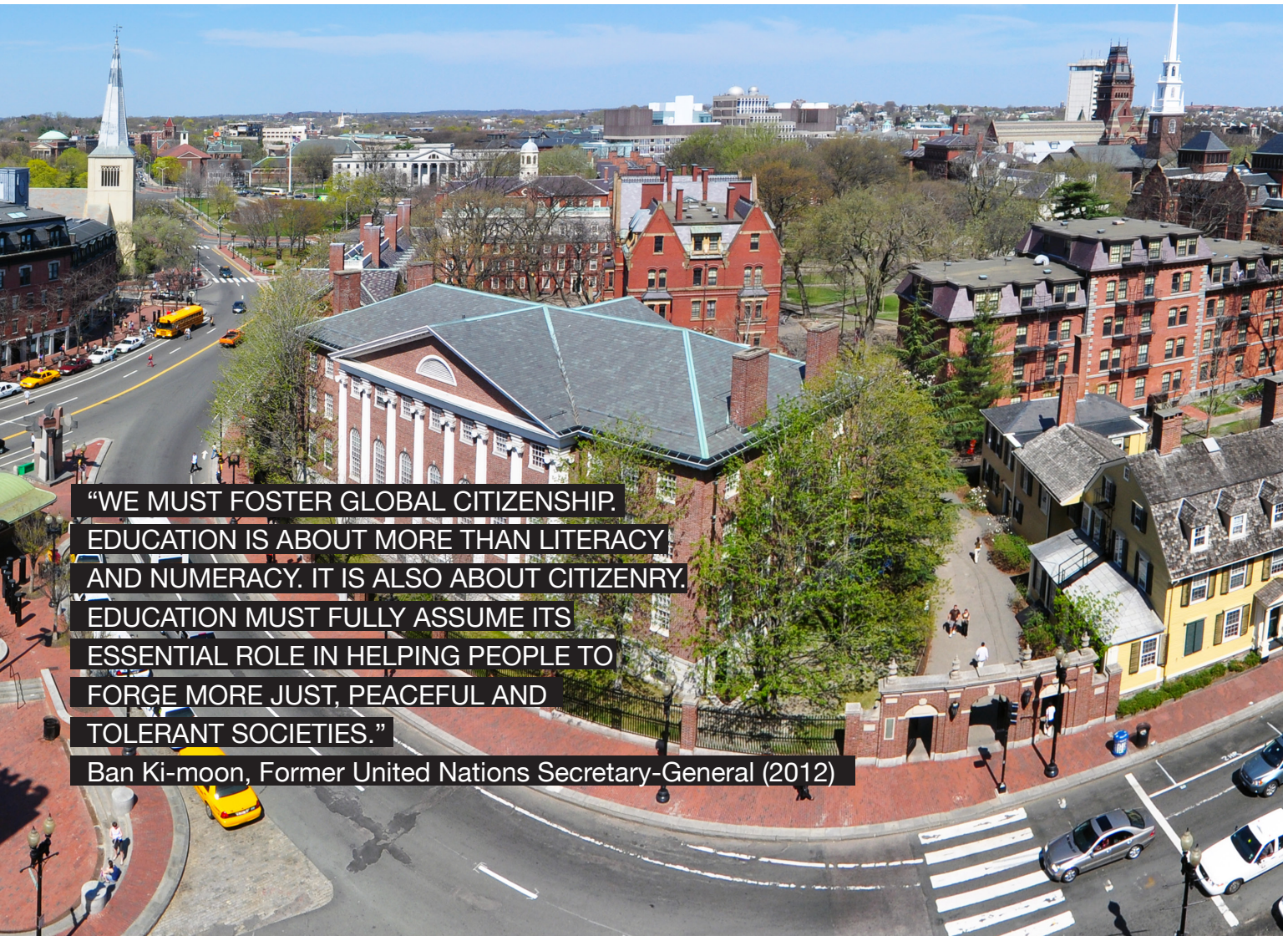


# Educational Divide Reform

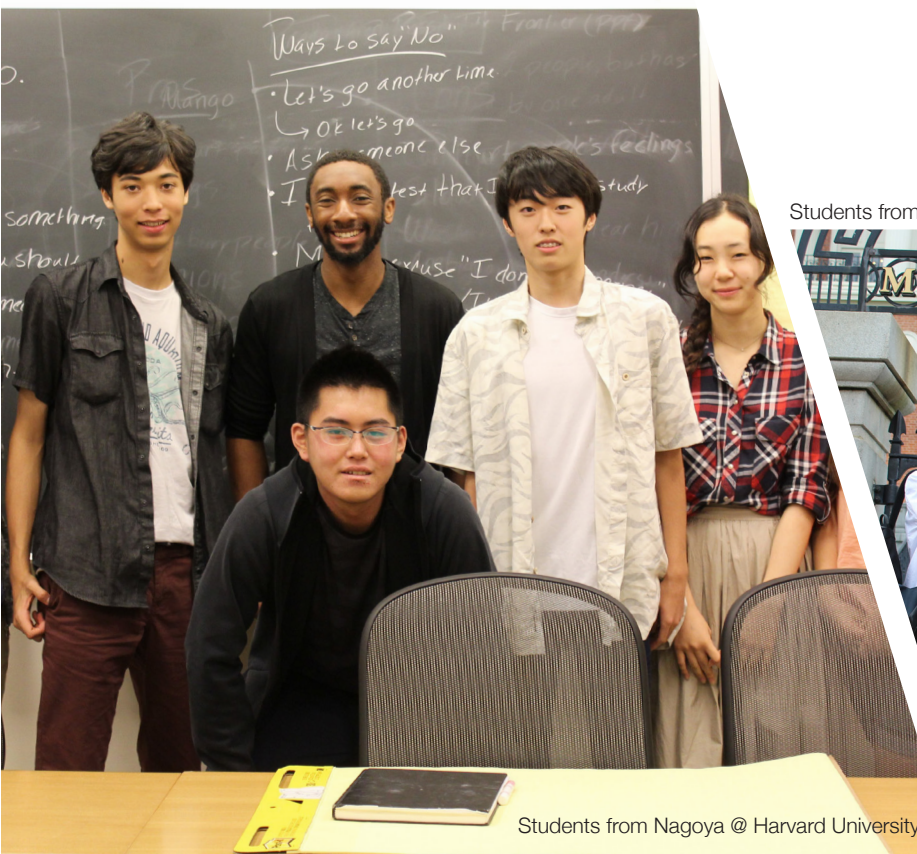
